
Family Engagement Specialist Irwin M. Jacobs Elementary School

Throughout the school

year we have been offering cinnamon raisin granola alongside yogurt on the breakfast menu. The granola is locallysourced from a company in Western MA and is made with simple ingredients:

Whole grain rolled oats, brown sugar, raisins, canola oil, dates, cinnamon, sea salt and nutmeg.

The company, Jeff's Granola, is a philanthropic organization that donates 100% of its profits to a 501c-3 charity chosen by the customer. This year's granola sales with NBPS FNS will merit a total contribution of \$778 being donated to PACE Food Bank of New Bedford!




The Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) department recognizes the immense value in student feedback and continues to seek student input on menu offerings. The team has implemented an initiative to support gathering feedback more frequently and from a larger number of students. This is currently being done through student surveys and lunchroom conversations and so far has been incredibly insightful. The feedback is being used to help the culinary team determine if a recipe needs further development to meet the taste preferences of the students, or if a particular item should be replaced with a different, more well-liked dish. JET offers a pathway to help you complete your Bachelor's degree, at little cost, and gain a Massachusetts teacher license.

JET supports the goals of building community teacher pipelines and developing an educator workforce that reflects the racial, cultural and linguistic diversity of students.

What JET can do for you

- Mentor and support you through your Bachelor's degree and teacher licensure completion
- > Advise you on teacher pathway programs in Massachusetts colleges/universities
- ➤ Help you access financial aid available to Massachusetts paraeducators
- > Connect you with a cohort of paraeducators working toward the goal of becoming licensed teachers
- > Provide you with professional and peer learning opportunities

How JET works

- 1. Apply online to the JET Program by March 1, 2023.

- 2. Advising and Onboarding April June 2023
 - 3. College Admissions and Enrollment
 - 4. Financial Aid
 - i. **FAFSA** https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa Must be completed prior to applying for the state grant below
 - ii. MA Paraprofessional Teacher Preparation Grant http://www.mass.edu/osfa/programs/teacherprep.asp
- 5. Once admitted to college and approved for financial aid, enroll in classes for 2023 Fall Semester
- 6. Attend required **JET** Cohort Meetings in June, August and January
- 7. Participate in the **IET** Mentoring and Support Program from September 2023 June 2024

Eligibility for JET

- Seeking a Bachelor's degree
- Career goal of becoming a Massachusetts licensed teacher
- Reside in Massachusetts for at least 1 year prior to upcoming academic year
- Employed for 2+ years as a paraeducator in a Massachusetts public school by June 30, 2023 **OR** seeking teacher licensure in a high needs area: Math, Science, Special Education, Foreign Languages, or Bilingual Education
- > U.S. citizen or non-citizen eligible under Title IV regulations
- > Not be in default of federal or state student education loans or have an unpaid college bill.
