### Mentoring and Induction Program Celebration
















Mentors and mentees were treated recently to an early dinner by *On The Go Catering* and raffle prize giveaways during their final meeting of the year.

NBHS Junior Emma Gibney was recently crowned Miss Massachusetts Teen 2023. The 23<sup>rd</sup> annual competition was held, May 7 at BMC Durfee High School Performing Arts Center. As Miss Massachusetts Teen, she received \$3,000 in scholarships and the pageant's Overall Academic Award.



Emma plans to dedicate her year of community service to her personal initiative, "S.T.A.Y.: Start the Awareness of Young Suicide Prevention." STAY is close to her heart as suicide



has impacted her family. In 2018, her cousin Tyler lost his long battle with mental health and committed suicide.

"He thought taking his own life was the only solution to the pain and suffering that he was feeling at that moment," she said. "I chose Suicide Prevention as my Community Service Initiative because I want other young adults to know

that suicide is not the answer."

Her commitment to community service is evident in her active participation on the Mayor's Youth Council. She is also an excellent student. A member of the Academy of Honors at NBHS, she is enrolled in Advance Placement and Honors classes. A past president of the National Junior Honor Society, Emma is on the Principal's Honor Roll and

has received a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math)
Award. Her future plans are to obtain a Bachelor Degree in Marine
Biology with the goal of becoming a marine biologist.

Emma is also a gifted athlete. She plays #1 Singles on the NBHS Varsity Tennis team, and was the Southcoast Player of the Week, and a member of the Southcoast All-Star team.
